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## **Postgraduate Courses:**

### **Course 1: The Fetus as a Patient**

#### **ACCME Accreditation**

#### **Learning Objectives:**

At the conclusion of the program, the participant will be able to:

- diagnose and manage alloimmune thrombocytopenia and red cell alloimmunization
- determine which patient is a candidate for cardiac valvuloplasty, cord coagulation, laser ablation of the placental vessels, in utero therapy for neural tube defect, and bladder shunting.

### **Course 2: Obstetric Controversies: What to do When Experts Disagree**
